6) **AI-written materials**

a. **Proposal for slight adjustment to Resources Generated by Artificial Intelligence in MORE Collection Maintenance Standards**

MORE respects the intellectual property of human authors and creators. MORE libraries should make every reasonable effort to avoid the purchase of AI-generated content or AI-generated audio editions of humancreated works. AI-generated content is any type of content, such as text, images, video, or audio which is wholly or partially created by any artificial intelligence model or machine-based learning software.

AI-generated content that is inadvertently added to the collection should be ~~labeled~~ **noted as such in the catalog record once staff are made aware of the origin. These items may be retained by the owning library if they meet that library's selection criteria and collection development policy and are ~~labeled~~ **noted** as being AI-generated in a brief catalog record ~~as well as on the physical item.~~**

AI-assisted content may be added to libraries' collections if they meet all selection criteria and are subject to the same requirements as human-created content. AI-assisted content is work that is written or created by a human, but for which AI tools were used to edit, refine, or error-check the work. If an item is AI-assisted, but still human-created, MORE does not require that the material be identified as such ~~in either the catalog or on the physical item.~~

Motion made by Leann F. to accept proposed changes in paragraph two and to amend the last line of paragraph three. Karen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

b) **Proposed procedure** for suspected AI materials

Library staff should report suspected AI-generated materials not clearly described as such in the catalog record via the IFLS help desk. Providing a title and bibliographic record number(s) is helpful.

2. IFLS staff will research the title in question using recommended identification methods.

3. IFLS staff may provide a recommendation to the owning library(ies) and/or cataloging staff based on their findings and in alignment with MORE Collection Maintenance Standards.

4. If IFLS staff find that the title in question likely contains AI-generated content and the owning library chooses to retain the material, IFLS staff will indicate suspected AI-content in a brief catalog record.

Motion made by Paula S. to accept proposed procedure, Jodi B. seconded the motion. Motion carried.

New Business:

7) **Content recommendations for 2027 MORE Budget:** Paula S. made a motion to approve increasing the annual OverDrive Advantage funding for 2027 to \$88,000 and to continue funding the High Demand/Collection Development at \$10,000. Jenna B. seconded. Motion carried.
