

# Skywalker Sugar Cookies

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1	cup butter, at room temperature
1	cup sugar
1	e99
1	teaspoon vanilla extract
3	cups all-purpose flour, plus more for dusting work surface
<sup>1</sup> /4	teaspoon salt
2	teaspoons baking powder

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 2. In a large bowl, beat the butter and sugar with the electric mixer on medium until fluffy. Add the egg and vanilla and mix to combine. In another bowl, mix together the 3 cups flour, salt, and baking powder. Add the dry ingredients to the butter mixture, 1 cup at a time, mixing completely after each addition.
- **3.** Turn the dough out onto a floured surface and knead a few times until smooth. Divide the dough in half, setting 1 portion aside. Roll out the dough  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch thick with the rolling pin, sprinkling with flour as needed. Cut out shapes with the cookie cutters. Gather up the dough scraps, roll them out again, and cut out more cookies. Repeat with the remaining half of the dough.
- **4.** Bake the cookies on an ungreased baking sheet until lightly golden, 7 to 9 minutes. Remove the cookies with a spatula to cooling rack to cool completely.
- **5.** Decorate with icing.

Makes about 4 dozen cookies.

# Yoda Soda

#### **INGREDIENTS**

		S

- 3 tablespoons sugar, or more to taste
- 1 cup sparkling water
- 1 scoop lime sherbet or sorbet
- 1. Place 1 lime on the cutting board and cut it in half. Squeeze the juice from each half into a measuring cup. Repeat with the remaining limes until you have  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup juice.
- **2.** Put the lime juice and 3 tablespoons sugar in a small pitcher. Stir with a wooden spoon until the sugar dissolves. Add the sparkling water and stir until mixed. Taste and add more sugar, if desired.
- **3.** Using an ice-cream scoop, scoop up the sherbet and drop it into a tall glass. Pour in the lime water. Serve immediately.

#### Makes 1 serving.

Variation: You can substitute rainbow sherbet or lemon sorbet for the lime sherbet.



HOW TO FOLD: A BASIC LIGHTSABER



Start with your color picture. Valley fold just enough to form a thin flap.



Valley fold and unfold.






Mark fold. Turn the model over.




Optional Step: To make a hilt with an angled emitter like Luke's, valley fold the corners to touch the creases formed in step 3.

## Ask the Fortune Wookiee!



#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- Directions: After each kid folds a cootiee catcher (instructions below), they write down eight different random predictions under the flaps and label them one to eight.
- After their predictions are written, the kids should partner up. If there are an uneven number of kids, it's okay to have groups of three. Now they will take turns asking each other's Fortune Wookiees for predictions.
- One kid is assigned as the "guesser" and one kid, along with his Fortune Wookiee, is assigned as the "fortune teller." First, the guesser asks the fortune teller's Fortune Wookiee a question they wish to be answered. Then they say their favorite Origami Yoda book (Origami Yoda, Darth Paper, Fortune Wookiee). The fortune teller spells out the answer by opening and closing the cootie catcher that many times (ex: O-R-I-G-A-M-I-Y-O-D-A).
- Next, the guesser picks their favorite Origami Yoda character and the fortune teller spells out the answer by opening and closing the cootie catcher that many times (ex:T-O-M-M-Y).
- Finally, the guesser picks a number from one of the four visible flaps. The choosen flap is opened to reveal the fortune. Add another element of fun! Have the fortune tellers give their best Chewbacca growl before revealing their prediction.
- The last step is for the kids to switch places as guesser and fortune teller so they each get a turn. They can continue to switch until all predictions are made.

#### Instructions on how to fold a Fortune Wookiee (template included on next page)

- 1) After cutting on the dotted white line, with blank side facing up, fold in half and unfold. Then fold in half in the other direction and unfold.
- 2) With blank side facing up, fold four corners of square into the center to form smaller square. Turn over without unfolding and fold four corners of square into the center again.
- 3) With brown and black triangles facing up, fold square in half toward you. Place thumbs and forefingers into all four outside pockets and bring them together to form Fortune Wookiee.







#### MASTER YODA STICK PUPPET

udge a puppet by its size, will you? Make up your own stories about the Jedi Master's adventures with this fun Yoda puppet. It's up to you which version you want to make—Prequel Trilogy Yoda, *Clone Wars* Yoda, or Original Trilogy Yoda.

#### WHAT YOU NEED

- Yoda body pattern
- Yoda robe pattern
- Scissors
- Green, brown, red, and tan or gray felt squares
- Straight pins
- Craft stick
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- 1 Cut out the Yoda body pattern on the next page and secure to the piece of green felt with straight pins. Then cut the felt following the pattern.



Cut out the Yoda robe pattern on the next page and secure to the piece of brown felt with straight pins. Then cut the felt following the pattern.






Now you need to make Yoda's tunic. Cut out a piece of tan or gray felt a little larger than the collar opening of the robe.
Glue this to the back of the robe.


- Glue the robe and tunic to Yoda's body.
- 5 Turn Yoda over and glue the craft stick to his back. Leave part of the stick exposed on the bottom so you have a handle for the puppet.
- 6 Finally, cut a small green square from the scrap felt for the nose and a small red triangle for the mouth. Glue these to Yoda's head along with the googly eyes to make his face!













### MAKE YOUR OWN POP-UP CLONE TROOPER

- Print the artwork out at 100% size (no scaling) on a heavy paper, such as card stock. Color all of your pieces with crayons or markers before scoring or cutting.
- 2. Use a ruler or a straight edge and a paper clip to score all the black dotted lines
- 3. Next use scissors to cut out all the pieces along the outside solid black lines.
- 4. On the helmet piece, there are two shapes that cannot be cut with scissors. These are located above "Glue C Here" and "Glue D Here." Please ask an adult to help you cut them out along the solid black lines with an X-Acto knife.
- 5. Take the card piece and fold along the dotted line toward you. Unfold.
- 6. Take the helmet piece and fold in half away from you. Unfold.
- 7. Now fold along the dotted line of the left side of the helmet piece away from you. The cut line in the middle will pop out. Unfold.
- 8. Next, fold along the dotted line to the left of the previously folded line away from you. Unfold.
- 9. Now fold the "Glue A Here" tab away from you. Unfold.
- 10. Repeat steps 7 and 8 on the right side of the helmet.
- 11. Next fold "Glue B" tab away from you and unfold.
- 12. Now fold the left upper part of the helmet along the dotted line away from you. Unfold. Repeat on the right side.
- 13. Take the "E" tab and fold it away from you. Unfold.
- 14. Take the "F" tab and fold it away from you. Unfold.
- 15. Fold the helmet piece in half again and put glue on the gray area marked "Glue B."
- 16. Next put tab "B" on top of the "Glue B" tab. Press firmly and let dry.
- 17. Now put glue on the "Glue A Here" tab.
- 18. Line up tab "A" on top of the "Glue A Here" tab. Press firmly and let dry. Set the helmet piece aside.
- 19. Now take the second piece and fold it in half away from you. Unfold.
- 20. Now fold tab "C" toward you. Repeat on tab "D."
- 21. Take the helmet piece (keep it folded in half) and put glue on "Glue C Here" area.
- 22. Take the second piece and line up tab "C" on top of the "Glue C Here" area. Press firmly and let dry. Repeat on the opposite side with tab "D."
- 23. Now take the card piece and put glue on "Glue E Here" area.
- 24. Take the helmet piece and line up tab "E" with the "Glue E Here" area. Press firmly and let dry.
- 25. Now put glue on the "Glue F Here" area.
- 26. Close the card on top of tab "F." Press firmly and let dry.
- 27. Slowly open the card and tah-dah! You've made your very own clone trooper!



### **MAKE YOUR OWN POP-UP YODA**

- 1. Print the artwork out at 100% size (no scaling) on a heavy paper, such as card stock. Color all of your pieces with crayons or markers before scoring or cutting.
- 2. Use a ruler or a straight edge and a paper clip to score all the black dotted lines.
- 3. Next use scissors to cut out all the pieces along the solid black lines.
- 4. Take Yoda's body piece and fold it in half away from you. Unfold.
- 5. Fold tab "A" toward you. Unfold. Repeat with tab "B."
- 6. Fold the right arm (with the lightsaber) toward you. Unfold.
- 7. Next fold along the diagonal dotted line away from you. Unfold.
- 8. Now fold tab "C" toward you. Unfold.
- 9. Next fold the "Glue E Here" away from you. Repeat on the next two dotted lines to tab "D." Set piece aside.
- 10. Next fold the card piece in half toward you. Unfold.
- 11. Put glue on the "Glue A Here" gray area.
- 12. Line up tab "A" with this area. Press firmly and let dry. Repeat with tab "B."
- 13. Now put glue on the "Glue C Here" area. Line up tab "C" with this area. Press firmly and let dry.
- 14. Turn the card around so you can see the "Glue D Here" gray area. Put glue on "Glue D Here."
- 15. Line up tab "D" with "Glue D Here" area. Press firmly and let dry.
- 16. Next put glue on the "Glue E Here" area.
- 17. Take piece "E" (Yoda's head) and line up the piece with the gray area. Press firmly and let dry.
- 18. Slowly close the card.
- 19. And reopen—you've made your very own Yoda!


