 - i. [Stonewall Book Awards](#)- given annually to English-language works of exceptional merit for children or teens relating to the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender experience.
 - ii. [Asian/Pacific American Awards for Literature](#)- The award promotes Asian/Pacific American culture and heritage and is awarded based on literary and artistic merit.
 - iii. [The Sydney Taylor Book Award](#)- presented annually to outstanding books for children and teens that authentically portray the Jewish experience.
 - iv. [Sophie Brody Medal](#)- is given to encourage, recognize and commend outstanding achievement in Jewish literature for adults.
 - v. [Harvey Awards](#)- Spotighting comic books, graphic novels, manga and more.
 - vi. [Andrew Carnegie Medal for excellence in fiction & nonfiction \(includes finalists in each category as well\)](#)- recognizes the best

fiction and nonfiction books for adult readers published in the U.S.

- vii. [William C. Morris Award](#)- honors a book published by a first-time author writing for teens and celebrating impressive new voices in young adult literature.

b. Lists:

- i. [Notable Books for adults](#)- make available to the nation's readers a list of 25 very good, very readable, and at times very important fiction, nonfiction, and poetry books for the adult reader.
- ii. [Notable Children's books](#)- includes books of especially commendable quality, books that exhibit venturesome creativity, and books of fiction, information, poetry and pictures for all age levels (birth through age 14) that reflect and encourage children's interests in exemplary ways.
- iii. [Core Excellence in Children's and Young Adult Science Fiction](#)- Recognizes excellence in Children's and Young adult science fiction.
- iv. [RUSA reading list](#)- seeks to highlight outstanding genre fiction that merit special attention by general adult readers and the librarians who work with them.
- v. [Best Fiction for Young Adults top 10](#)- fiction titles published for young adults that are recommended reading for ages 12 to 18.
- vi. [Quick Picks for Reluctant Readers top 10](#)- identifies titles aimed at encouraging reading among teens who dislike to read for whatever reason.
- vii. [Amazing Audiobooks top 10](#)- an annual list of notable audio recordings significant to young adults from those released in the past two years.
