8. Resume discussion of bounced/undelivered notices

Since that meeting:

- MORE has a new text message notice option with its own set of procedures for handling undelivered texts
- Several libraries have started using LX Starter for customizable, graphical email notices, for which the bounce notification system works differently compared to email notices sent directly from Sierra: https://iflsweb.org/knowledge-base/notices-sending-by-text-message#articleTOC_2

9. IFLS recommendation to use no tape on library materials when sharing among libraries

3M has discontinued producing the popular Scotch 811 Removable Tape. Our Demco rep has said that, unfortunately, there isn't a true one-for-one replacement for the discontinued Scotch 811. In the absence of library material-safe tape, IFLS proposes a new guideline to use no tape on materials shared among libraries.

Several instances of: “...Insert the form in the item as a flag ~~or use removable tape to attach it to the outside of the item over the barcode~~”

Library-provided supplies

~~Removable Scotch Tape—Limit the use of tape whenever possible. When necessary, only use removeable Scotch tape when affixing routing labels to library materials, tape down both ends. Regular tape will damage materials.~~
